

RESEARCH ACTIVITY

The doctorate – which is essentially focused on the study of the legal models related to the protection of the person and the analysis of economic and entrepreneurial dynamics – starting from the study of the classic themes of law in areas of specific research interest is aimed, in an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary perspective, to deepen the themes of development and competitiveness also from a financial, labour and tax point of view, and to allow students to acquire an individual and autonomous scientific research ability, such as to allow the emergence of a critical spirit and methodological rigor.

The field of study to which the doctorate is essentially dedicated mainly concerns the private legal disciplines that are most affected by the processes of evolution and change of law in the current era, and therefore, among others, the Law of Obligations and Contracts, Property Law, but also Law of the Family and of Succession; Commercial and Company Law (including the issues of Insolvency Law); Banking and Financial Markets Laws; Intellectual Property and Competition Law; Labour Law, as well as their tax implications. These disciplines are also subject of a comparative analysis, which is promoted through research stays of the doctoral students at universities and research centers abroad.

The research activity is carried out by each PhD student under the individual and regular supervision of a Tutor. During the three-year period, the PhD student will be committed to conducting the research and regularly report on its progress both to the Tutor – in individual and seminar meetings – and to the Board of Professors at the end of each year.
