

## **TRAINING PROGRAM**

The Doctoral program includes lectures and dedicated seminars as well as an individual and regular supervision of a specialist Tutor assigned to provide guidance on the writing of the PhD thesis. In particular, the student is required to take part in preparing cycles of lectures and in-depth seminars organized at the Department of Law or at other University locations.

Therefore, in addition to the specific study and individual research path, the Doctoral program provides specific/targeted interdisciplinary meetings, aimed at integrating the different research perspectives involved.

The training activities also enable the learning of foreign languages, in particular English, as well as computer skills necessary to carry out the research. For this purpose, PhD students will be able to take advantage of the facilities available in the proposing Department and in general in the University.

The doctorate aims not only at academic, but also professional training of skilled jurists. The course aims at the training of highly qualified scholars in the field of legal, scientific research for the academic career in Italy and abroad and, moreover, high-level professional figures for forensic careers (judiciary and advocacy), public notaries, accountants, corporate lawyers, as well as managers and officials of the Public Administration.

The aim is to train research doctors who have mastered the legal method and tools, as well as endowed with autonomous reflection skills, which are indispensable given the continuous evolution of the legal system.

The course is also characterized by openness to comparative method and studies, which distinguish legal research conducted on cases and problems/problem-oriented, with strong learning and operational implications. In fact, peculiar importance will be given to the requirement of internationalization, also through the provision of periods of research stay abroad for doctoral students at foreign universities, aimed at stimulating cultural exchange and deepening the topics studied in a comparative perspective.

During the training period abroad, scholarship holders enjoy a 50 percent increase in their scholarship for up to 18 months.

Starting from the 2nd year of the course, in addition, all PhD students have access to an annual budget specifically dedicated to supporting training and research activities.
