

TEACHING ACTIVITIES AND ORGANIZATION OF THE COURSE

The PhD programme in Economic Law lasts three years and requires the completion of 180 ECTS credits (60 ECTS credits per year).

During these three years, alongside participating in conferences and seminars organised by the Department of Law, PhD students are expected to actively engage in didactic activities coordinated by the PhD Scientific Board. At the start of each academic year, the Board identifies one or more thematic areas, which are then analysed by each subject within its own academic discipline. The Board prepares an annual calendar, assigning each discipline to organise seminars and lectures within its designated period. These didactic activities, covering both practical and theoretical topics, also involve Professors, Researchers, and PhD students as teachers. From the second year onwards, doctoral students are expected to deliver lectures, presenting their colleagues with a chapter of their thesis, a publication, or their current scientific research. This not only fosters discussion and exchange of ideas but also helps students develop teaching skills.

Additionally, PhD students may undertake supplementary teaching, tutoring, and student support activities, provided these do not exceed 40 hours per year and do not interfere with their research.
